Arthur's library experience was always valuable to us in selecting the WPL special projects for support through our fundraising.

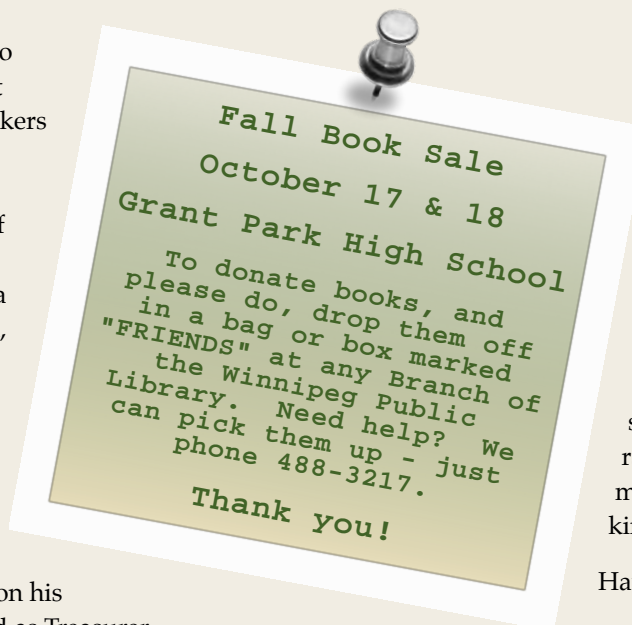
Then we welcomed two new Board members in June.

Once I was married and came into Winnipeg, our children attended Shaughnessy Park School and there was a bookmobile which I avidly used for myself and the children.



The Sir William Stephenson Library was built in 1997, so now I can just walk over to enjoy books, magazines, newspapers. I have frequently rented the meeting room for groups that I belong to. There is so much space in the new library and they offer many different programs for all ages.
