From Ed Cuddy, Manager of Library Services



It's a pleasure to introduce myself to the readers of NOTES and supporters of the Friends of Winnipeg Public Library (FWPL).

Libraries have loomed large in my life since grade school. I have vivid memories of visits to the old Charleswood Library with my mother to borrow Alfred Hitchcock collections like "Stories Not for the Nervous" or "Stories to be Read with the Door Locked". My mother supported her children's reading interests wherever they landed and I've adopted this "reader's right to read" approach with my own kids.

Skip ahead a few years to 2017 and I've worked for WPL for over thirty years. I started as a reference librarian at Centennial and then moved to various positions including adult services librarian, information services librarian and branch head at Fort Garry, Centennial and Henderson libraries. I joined the administrative team in 2011 and most recently, took on the Manager of Library Services job after Rick Walker's retirement in August, 2016.

Rick asked me to take on the Friends Library Liaison role in 2011. After undergoing a secret initiation rite (I can say it involved tea and cookies), I was welcomed aboard. Since then, I've worked with the lively and creative FWPL board on initiatives such as purchasing animal ottomans for WPL branches, contributing toward Library family literacy playground activity stations, and numerous events, library projects and programs supported by the FWPL. The Friends have an incredible passion for libraries and their many contributions to WPL, all done on a volunteer basis, are inspiring! And the Library liaison role is now in the good hands of Theresa Lomas.

And as I write these words, it occurs to me that the kid who visited Charleswood Library in the 60s to take out scary stories had no idea he'd end up performing one of those stories (Lamb to the Slaughter by Roald Dahl) with the "Tales at Night" adult story time team at the Good Will Social Club in 2016. Just another connection, one of many, made every day at the Library.

Welcome Back, Coreen!

Coreen Molloy, a volunteer at the Best of Friends Gift Shop since 2005, is pleased to be back: she missed being at the Shop during her recuperation.

In 2005, Coreen, a retired mental health care worker, when visiting Millennium Library, was immediately interested in the new gift shop both for its wares and its raison d'etre. As a child she had such a good library experience – fond memories of visiting Cornish Library, and sometimes then playing on its riverbank (perhaps without parental permission) – that she realized the importance of libraries and the value of the Gift Shop, the profits from which support the Library system. She enjoys showing visitors all that the Shop offers, but in particular Coreen says the jewelry "offers a nice range in pricing, is gorgeous, quite remarkable, unique". River Heights Library Relocation

Our Friends organization is one of several Winnipeg Public Library stakeholder groups that include Winnipeg Public Library Board, Library Advisory Committees and the Winnipeg Library Foundation. Our president, Kathy Blight, attended stakeholder sessions regarding the relocation of River Heights Library, which does not meet accessibility standards, has significant structural issues, and lacks adequate parking.

Kathy reports that the site that is being considered is at the corner of Grant and Cambridge, and would be part of

the Grant Park Recreation Campus Project. All stakeholders from this area have been part of the discussion. The project priority at this time is the River Heights Library, which would be increased to approximately 14,000 sq. ft.
